

The 2013 Spring Racing Carnival on Seven and 7TWO

As the home of horse racing on free-to-air TV, Seven will broadcast the Caulfield Cup Carnival and the Cox Plate as well as the Melbourne Cup Carnival LIVE on Seven and 7TWO.

Channel Seven has long been the TV home of the iconic Melbourne Cup Carnival at Flemington and the race that stops the nation.

But this year, under a new broadcast partnership with TVN and the racing industry, Seven's coverage has been expanded to encompass every major race-day on the Australian racing calendar – including the celebrated Spring Racing Carnival.

So for the first time all the iconic horseraces can be seen in one place, LIVE and FREE on Seven and 7TWO around Australia – from the Caulfield Guineas and Caulfield Cup to the Cox Plate as well as the Victoria Derby, Crown Oaks, Emirates Stakes and, of course, the 153rd running of the Melbourne Cup.

From this Saturday, when Guineas Day heralds the opening of festivities at Caulfield Racecourse, Seven's coverage will be hosted by the venerated Bruce McAvaney alongside Francesca Cumani, Richard Freedman and Simon Marshall.

Giaan Rooney and Neil Kearney will keep viewers up to date with all the news and festivities from around the track while Seven's horseback interviewer John Letts saddles up with Banjo again, including for the 20th anniversary of their first Melbourne Cup together, when Vintage Crop was the first foreign raider to win the Cup in 1993.

Throughout the Spring they will be joined by an unrivaled line-up of horseracing experts and TV presenters including Hamish McLachlan, Peter Donegan, Pat Welsh, Rebecca Maddern, Joh Griggs, Edwina Bartholomew, Rachael Finch, Melanie Vallejo and Scherri-Lee Biggs.

TVN's Richie Callander and Jason Richardson will also join the coverage as guest experts at times throughout the carnival.

They are the public faces of what is a huge production unit, involving hundreds of personnel and up to 50 cameras – around the courses, in tracking vehicles, in the air, in the jockeys' and stewards' rooms and also at times mounted on a jockey's helmet to drop viewers into the saddle during the race itself.

Seven is the free-to-air leader in sports television with a portfolio of major events that includes AFL, the Australian Open and Wimbledon tennis, the Sydney-Hobart Yacht Race, the Australian Masters, Australian Open and Perth International golf, V8 Supercars and Bathurst 1000 and the Sydney Autumn Racing Carnival – not to mention special events like the A-League football games featuring Manchester United and Liverpool.
