Each contestant will need to share their strengths with their partner in order to succeed.


There will be plenty of fun, laughter and teamwork along with miscommunication and frustration as the teams bond to overcome their differences in pursuit of a \$100,000 prize.



"You see girls like that [Beauties] but I would never have the guts to approach them. I would be star struck by the Beauties as I've never seen many girls like that before."



Candice admits she has done some crazy things in her search for the perfect partner.


"I once went on a date with a guy I really didn't like. And I kept on dating him thinking I needed to give him a chance. Needless to say, it didn't work out," she laughs.


The talkative American, who has a fear of bugs. admits she usually takes two hours to get ready in the morning, or more if she gets "side tracked by something sparkly."
