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Seven scores over 2m for epic Australian Open final

Novak Djokovic's thrilling four-set win over Andy Murray to claim the 2013 Australian Open title drew a huge peak audience of 2.635m and average five-city metro audience of 2.120m.

The marathon encounter was the number one show and ensured Seven dominated the night in primetime with a combined network share of 49.5 per cent in metro regions, and 44.5 per cent on the primary channel.

Nine trailed with a combined network share of 19.8 per cent (13.4 per cent on primary) and Ten was also well behind with a share of 15.0 per cent (10.3 per cent on primary).

The preview show (peak: 1.639m; av: 1.158m) also performed strongly with a 23.5 per cent growth year on year.

The Australian Open final reached 4.488m viewers.
